

2007 Joint Meeting Passover Resource Guide

Events & Programs Hosted by ACPA/NASPA

Social Justice Seder:

A team of students from around the country will lead for us a Social Justice Seder in order to bring together our Jewish and non-Jewish attendants in celebration and reflection on the social justice issues of inclusion, struggle, and freedom found in the Passover story. The Social Justice Seder will be held in Osceola B (Gaylord) on Monday, April 2nd at 7:00 PM. All ACPA and NASPA members are welcome at this event, regardless of religious or spiritual orientation, which will include a full meal of traditional Kosher-for-Passover foods. Please note that advance sign-ups for this event are required and the deadline to sign-up for the Social Justice Seder was March 11th. 2nd Seder Opportunity:

The Seder Planning Committee has worked with Central Florida Hillel and Rollins College to offer a 2nd Seder opportunity on Tuesday, April 3rd for those who wish to participate in this tradition. The Seder will begin at 6:00 PM in the Galloway Room, located in the Mills Building at Rollins. It may last until 8:00 PM, but it's student led, so who knows! Interested participants should sign-up on the "2nd Seder Ride Share List" at the Hospitality table in either the Gaylord or Marriott Hotel and then meet at the Hospitality table to group up and share Taxis to/from Rollins College.

Note: Attendees should meet at 5:00 PM at the Hospitality table in order to make it Rollins on time as the college is approximately 25 miles away. Rollins College is located at 1000 Holt Ave, Winter Park, FL 32789.

Marriott Hotel Restaurants

Sherry Nevits, who is in charge of restaurants and catering at the Marriott restaurants has assured us that there would be potatoes at all meals; that she is ordering matzoh so that it will be available in the restaurants; and that meals can be served on paper, and with plastic utensils. That won't do for those who keep Passover most observantly, but will cover many who are sort of "middle-of-the roaders." She's Jewish herself, so understands the dynamics, and the variance in levels of observance.

Restaurants and Grocery Stores

Publix Supermarket sells the basic supermarket foods with an OU or OK etc.

They also have the typical kosher section with manishevitz and matzah, Tam Tams, grape juice, gefilte, etc. They carry some frozen "empire" and "meal mart" meat. They also have some Kosher wines.

Located on Sandlake Rd. (corner Dr. Phillips Blvd.)

Albertson's Supermarket carries Cholov Yisroel Milk, yogurts and cheeses, and many more kosher products (spreads, some meats, etc.) Located on the corner of 434 & Montgomery (a few blocks from the 436) in Longwood (1 hr from parks area)

A Glatt kosher meal (airline style) can be ordered to be picked up/eaten at any Disney restaurant in The Walt Disney Resorts/Attractions.

Any sit-down restaurant or full-service restaurant in the Parks or Hotels can accommodate Kosher meals. You need to order Kosher meals through 407-WDW-DINE at least 24 hours in advance. A Credit Card is required to guarantee your meal. The full price of ordered meals will be charged if you are a no-show. Prices for Entrees are the same for Adults and Children except when ordering a Kid's Meal Entree.

Dinner Show Prices: Guests are charged the regular Dinner show prices. Guests will only receive one meal, this will not be all-you-care-to-eat.

Buffets and all-you-care-to-eat locations: Guests will only receive one meal, this will not be all-you-care-to-eat. Guest will be charged Kosher Meal price.

Credit Card Guarantee: Credit card is required as a guarantee. Full price of ordered meals will be charged if guest no-shows.

Packages: 1 appetizer, 1 entree and 1 dessert per guest apply to package plans (including Deluxe Magic, Grand Plan, etc.)

PACKAGING: Entrees are plated on an ovenable three compartment plastic dish, wrapped in a Kosher labeled ovenable bag. Entrees include a vegetable and starch accompaniment, two dinner rolls and stainless utensils. Pasta shells include only the vegetable, no starch. Meals are individually boxed.

VENDOR INFORMATION: Weberman products are Glatt Kosher and are certified by Orthodox Rabbinical Council of South Florida (O.R.C.) and by the National Koshruth organization (N.K.)
